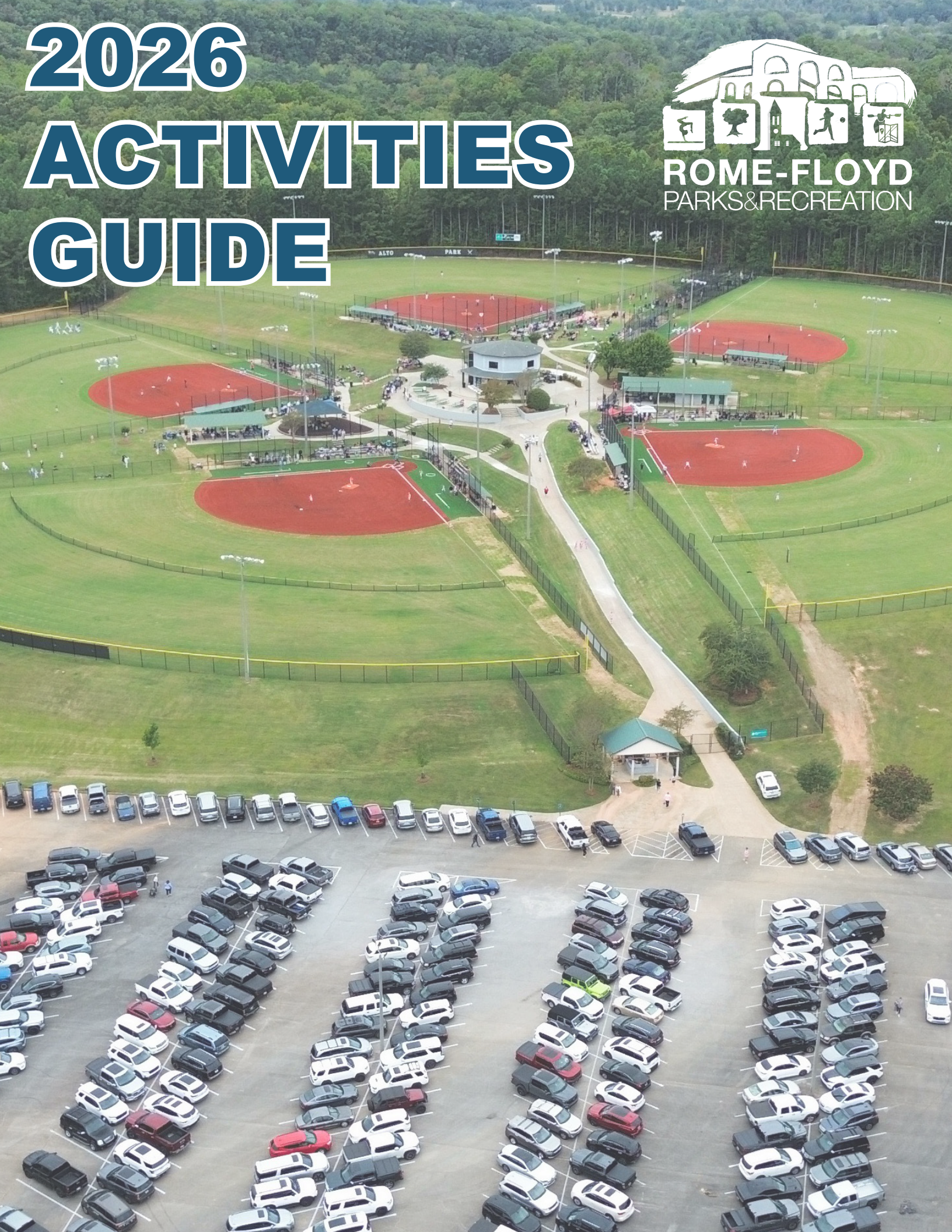

HOW WE ARE FUNDED

Capital improvements to City-owned facilities are provided by the City Commission. Capital improvements to County-owned facilities are provided by the County Commission. Operating expenses are provided in part by the County General Fund (60%) and in part by the fees and charges paid by users taking advantage of the programs and services offered by RFPR (40%). This provides a "pay as you play" philosophy.

RFPRA HEADQUARTERS

1 Shorter Avenue

RFPRA Headquarters houses the director's and staff offices. The Rome-Floyd Parks and Recreation Administrative Headquarters is home to the director's office, as well as the offices of the program and sports coordinators and administrative staff.

You can visit this facility to register for seasonal sports, summer camps, special events and programs. Coaches register and meet here as well. This facility also houses the Rome Aerials Gymnastics Center.

Office hours are Monday to Thursday 9:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. and Friday 9:00 a.m. to 5 p.m.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

All teams and volunteer coaches are under the direction of the Rome-Floyd Parks and Recreation Department. All volunteers will undergo background checks.

MULTI-SIBLING DISCOUNT

This discount is only available during the regular registration period and is a \$10 discount per participant after the first registration fee. This is only available for camps and recreational sports.

GATE FEES AT YOUTH GAMES

Spectators pay \$5 for prep league baseball games. Spectators pay \$5 for pre-season tournament games for the following: spring and fall baseball, fall softball and basketball. Spectators pay \$2 for regular season basketball games. Spectators pay \$3 for regular season football games and \$5 for playoff games. All transactions are card only.

REGISTRATION

Registration can be done online at RFPRA.com or in person at Rome-Floyd Parks and Recreation Department at 1 Shorter Ave. Birth certificates are required to participate in sports programs. For more information on registrations, please contact our front office at 706.291.0766.

FEES

Fees to participate in sports, programs, events and more are listed throughout the guide. Many sports have different fees based on registration date and length of season.

Players not living within Rome-Floyd County are required to sign up as a non-resident and pay an additional fee.

Uniforms and equipment are not included in the registration fee. The equipment and uniforms are the responsibility of the parents/teams. **All of our facilities are cashless and require card or check for payments.**

FEE ASSISTANCE

Rome-Floyd Parks and Recreation offers income based fee assistance to Rome and Floyd County residents. Parents or guardians must fill out forms available online at RFPRA.com or our offices at 1 Shorter Ave.

Fees can be reduced between 50 to 75 percent for individual sports, camps and programs organized by Rome-Floyd Parks and Recreation.

Fee assistance can't be used for event travel, uniforms, equipment or admissions to events. It can't be used for facility rentals or road races.

REFUND POLICY

Refunds will be considered under certain circumstances.

- Registrants must assume full responsibility for any changes in their personal life which may affect their ability to participate.
- If a program is canceled, the participant will receive a full refund.
- Refunds will not be granted due to team placement or coaching preferences.
- Refund requests based on injuries or medical limitations must be accompanied with a medical doctor's examination report.
- Only the program fee may be refunded. Equipment and/or uniform fees will not be refunded.

TEAM FORMATIONS

All participants must register to play for the team from the school district in which they currently attend. All tuition-based schools will be placed together to form teams when possible. All home school students will be placed on teams based on school district currently living in.

In cases where a school district does not have enough participants to form teams, those participants will be combined with another district to ensure participation.

COACH SELECTION

Rome-Floyd Parks and Recreation Authority feels that our coaches set an example not only for the kids but also the parents. Selecting quality, qualified, and well-rounded coaches is a top priority.

All coaches must complete a coaching application and sign the coaches' code of conduct form before a coach can be considered by the Rome-Floyd Parks and Recreation. They will also need to email a head shot to be used on their coaching badge.

Background checks will be completed on all coaches for every sport. All head coaches must be at least 21 years of age, and all assistant coaches must be at least 18 years of age.

BEHAVIOR POLICY

Please be advised that all parents of children who participate in any Rome-Floyd Parks and Recreation program are expected to conduct themselves in a courteous and respectful manner and sign the code of conduct.

Parents should not use profanity, threats or insulting language. Parents should not engage in any controversial conversations with supervisors, game officials, spectators or coaches.

Any parent having any concern regarding a supervisor, program employee and/or a coach's performance should refrain from speaking with said person. Instead, the parent should contact the program coordinator regarding that concern.

AGE CONTROL DATE

Age control date for recreation baseball, t-ball, football, softball, football, cheerleading and volleyball is the players age on or before Sept. 1, 2026.

SPORTS PHILOSOPHY

It is the intent of Rome-Floyd Parks and Recreation Authority to offer a program on an equal opportunity basis. Rome-Floyd Parks and Recreation believes that competing in youth sports is crucial to developing character and self-esteem.

Rome-Floyd Parks and Recreation also believes that lessons learned in competition can be applied in all life endeavors. All individuals wishing to participate will not be discouraged from doing so. Teams are organized to maximize participation for all. Each participant who is dressed out and fit to play will play.

Rome-Floyd Parks and Recreation views all volunteer coaches as integral components to the success of the program. Cooperation and communication are essential to maintain a quality experience for all.

Coaches should strive to maintain a good working relationship with parents, players, and the program coordinator. Participants will reflect the character and attitude of the coaches.

It is imperative that all coaches display and model excellent sportsmanship and high moral character at all times. Coaches should refrain from any action that would tarnish their reputation with the teams in their league or the program.

FAQS

Q: Why are some games scheduled during times which conflict with church and school activities?

A: Schedules are planned based on the number of teams in a league and the number of games in a season. RFPPRA has a limited number of game-level facilities and games can only be played during certain times of the day. In essence, there may be too many games to avoid conflicts with other organizations' programs.

Q: After I register, how soon will I hear from my coach?

A: Your coach will contact you within 72 hours after the coaches' meetings. Coaches' meetings take place about a week after registration has ended.

Q: Can my child play on the same team as another child or for a specific coach?

A: We do our best to honor these requests, but cannot guarantee all requests will be honored. It is dependent upon roster space and availability.

BASEBALL

The recreational baseball program focuses on teaching fundamentals, skills, teamwork and fun. Teams can practice two nights a week. The season consists of 10 games plus a post-season tournament in the spring. The fall season doesn't have a tournament.

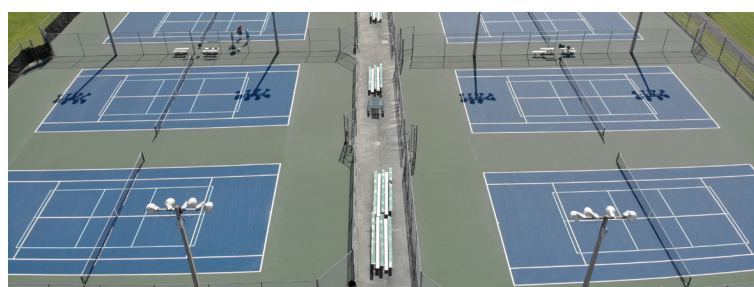

VENDOR POLICY

All vendors, coaches, trainers or other persons using parks or facilities and charging for services must be registered as a vendor.

All persons, partnerships and corporations interested in vending in a City or County park are required to submit the following documents to Rome-Floyd Parks and Recreation, 1 Shorter Ave., Rome, GA 30165; (706) 291-0766.

- A letter of application which includes the applicant's full name; name of business; residence and business addresses, phone numbers, and email address and the vending location requested.
- A photograph and measurements of the vending unit to be used in the vending operation.
- A typed list of items to be sold and the prices to be charged for same.

A vendor certificate including all required licenses must be prominently displayed on the mobile unit from which the vendor operates. Park vendors must keep a copy of the approved Parks and Recreation application available for inspection at all times.

Rome-Floyd Parks and Recreation reserves the right to limit the number of vendors allowed in any one park and the total number of permits issued in any one year. RFPRA further reserves the right to limit the vending unit size based on park aesthetics and available vending space in each park. The business of park vending shall be conducted from dawn till dusk.
